- For Webelos, it counts toward the Arrow of Light adventure **Building a Better World**.
- Boy Scouts can check off a requirement for the <u>Citizenship in the World merit</u> <u>badge</u> and the <u>Radio merit badge</u>.
- All Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, Varsity Scouts, Venturers and adult leaders can count the event toward the requirements for the <u>International Spirit Award</u>.
